# **Home Health Care Services**

DSFHS is a certified, Joint Commission-accredited agency focused on helping people in all stages of life get access to highly skilled nursing care. We enable patients to receive the benefits of at-home recuperation and recovery by providing comprehensive medical services.

All nursing care provided in the home is done by DSFHS Registered Nurses (RN) and Licensed Practical Nurses (LPN), and is often paired with other supportive services and therapies, as determined by a patient's physician or surgeon.

## **Charitable Programs**

Dominican Sisters Family Health Service spearheads a diverse range of life-changing charitable programs, rooted in Catholic traditions, which support children, seniors and families in underserved communities.

### HEALTH HOME PROGRAM

A Medicaid reimbursable program that offers comprehensive care allowing all of a patient's caregivers to communicate with one another so that all of his/her needs are addressed. Services include medical care coordination for individuals who have chronic illnesses. Currently, these services are offered in coordination with Bronx-Lebanon Hospital.

### INFANT/TODDLER/PARENTS PROGRAM (ITPP)

A community based charitable program, ITPP provides early childhood education, assessment and interventions for children from birth to 3 years of age, along with family support services for parents. This program is center-based as well as home-based.

Ryan White Part D Funding: Offers medical and supportive services to HIV positive women, children, infants, youth, and their affected family members.

### **HIV & HEPATITIS C COUNSELING & TESTING**

Our Rapid Counseling and Testing programs are provided on site, in our South Bronx location and at local community-based organizations.

LINKAGE TO LIFE PROGRAM This program works intensely with families at risk for child abuse and neglect to prevent placement outside of the home and is funded through the New York City Administration for Children's Services (ACS). Services include general case management and parenting workshops.

Provides a wide range of social services and workshops, helping clients with health assessments and HIV Counseling and Testing, government assistance, and a wide range of services and referrals with partner agencies in the South Bronx community.

### HELPING HANDS PROGRAM

Designed to meet the needs of the elderly or disabled of any age living in the townships of Riverhead and Southampton, this program provides non-medical services by homeworkers, including: light housekeeping, laundry, shopping, and friendly visiting to enable residents to live independently in their own homes. A cost share for this program's services is based on a sliding income scale. There is no charge for those who meet the charitable eligibility criteria.

### **COMMUNITY WALK-IN CENTER** FOR HEALTH & WELLNESS

### **EXPANDED IN-HOME SERVICES PROGRAM FOR THE ELDERLY**

Funded by the Suffolk County Office for Aging, this program is administered by DSFHS to provide non-medical support services for residents of Southampton who are 60 years of age or older.

### **COMMUNITY OUTREACH**

Street Fair in the Bronx with ArchCare (DSFHS)—In June 2015, DSFHS participated in Archcare's Health Fair at Christ the King Church in the Bronx. DSFHS community outreach workers provided preventative and educational services to the community participants during the health fair. Services offered included Hepatitis C (HCV) Rapid Testing, which allowed individuals to receive the HCV Rapid tests in less than 20 minutes to learn their HCV status and receive educational preventative and treatment resources.




